Older members of the School, both those who have left and those still about, will remember with great fondness Mrs Patricia (Pat) Ohlmus who died in Griffith on 6 April aged 90. Known universally as "Mrs O", she was the School's Administrative Officer from 1959 to 1984. In Fire in the Belly, Ophel and Jenkin paint a sympathetic and accurate picture of her, writing that she 'treated everyone in the School with warm friendliness and the same polite formality. Students were always Mr or Miss until their degree was conferred, thereafter it became Doctor'. It was typical of her 'lively and caring concern for everything going on in the School.' Her 25 years serving the School were years of great change; hers was the welcoming and unchanging face in the School Administration during those years.

STAFF MOVEMENTS

Professor Anatol Kirillov, Research Institute for Mathematical Sciences, Kyoto University, is visiting the Department of Theoretical Physics for next two weeks. He is conducting collaborative research with Professor Vladimir Bazhanov.

Professor Murray Batchelor, Theoretical Physics, will be absent from April 10-25 to Chair the Annual Board meeting for J Phys A. He will also visit the Universities of Oxford, Aberdeen and Edinburgh and give an invited talk at the 14th Annual UK Meeting on Integrable Models, Conformal Field Theory and Related Topics in Canterbury.

Professor George Dracoulis, Department of Nuclear Physics, will be overseas from 13 April to 4 June 2010. He will be based mainly at the University of Surrey, UK for collaborative research and present several seminars, including the opening talk at the international Workshop on Nuclear Isomers to be held in late May. He is also an invited speaker at the 2010 IOP Nuclear Physics Conference at the University of Edinburgh (18/4 to 21/4), While at Surrey, he will take part in a Storage Ring experiment at GSI-Germany to measure the masses of exotic nuclei, as well as giving seminars at Liverpool and Manchester Universities. On his return he will visit Argonne National Laboratory as part of a collaborative project on the development of the new CARIBU facility, aimed at exploiting neutron-rich beams from fission fragments, together with Greg Lane from the Department of Nuclear Physics and Michael Smith who is visiting Argonne for an extended period as part of his ANU PhD project.

PhD students Mr Maurits Evers and Mr Duc Huy Luong, Department of Nuclear Physics, have been selected to participate in the European Centre for Theoretical Studies in Nuclear Physics and Related Areas Doctoral Training Program 2010 "Nuclear Structure and Nuclear Astrophysics with Radioactive Ion Beams", Trento, Italy.
