Last year, Deputy Director Ken Baldwin was a member of an Australian climbing team that made the first ascent of a 6,547m Himalayan peak on the Nepal-Tibet border. The Canberra-based expedition included a number of former ANU Mountaineering Club members, including Tim Macartney-Snape - the first Australian to climb Everest and the first person to do so all the way from sea level. The expedition will be holding a slide evening to help raise funds for the Fred Hollowes Foundation, details above. The event hopes to raise funds for a second eye camp in a remote region of Nepal, further to the one that was held during the expedition.
