AUSTRALIAN ACADEMY OF SCIENCE

Academy welcomes new Council members

Internationally-recognised experts in computing and atmospheric physics, developmental biology, organometallic chemistry and evolutionary genetics have been elected to join the Australian Academy of Science's Council from May 2013.

Evolutionary genetics Professor Oliver Mayo, of CSIRO Livestock Industries and the University of Adelaide, will become the new Treasurer, replacing Professor Michael Dopita of the Australian National University.

Organometallic chemist Professor Les Field, Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Research) at the University of New South Wales, will assume the role of Secretary for Science Policy, succeeding Professor Bob Williamson of the University of Melbourne.

Professor Williamson and Professor Dopita have served on Council's Executive Committee with great energy, dedication and insight, said Academy President, Professor Suzanne Cory. The Academy is deeply indebted to them for their hard work over the last four years.

It will be a pleasure to welcome our two new Secretaries, Professor Field and Professor Mayo. I am sure they will prove to be equally dedicated in these important leadership roles.

Also stepping down in May are Council members for the physical sciences, Professor Yiu-Wing Mai of the University of Sydney and Professor Mark von Itzstein of Griffith University.

Their roles will be filled by electronic materials leader Professor James Williams of the Australian National University, and Professor Robert Vincent, leader in atmospheric physics at Adelaide University.

Nobel Laureate Professor Brian Schmidt of the Australian National University, who this year filled a casual vacancy that arose on Council, was also elected as a member for the physical sciences.

Developmental biologist Professor Peter Koopman of the University of Queensland will replace Professor Richard Hobbs of the University of Western Australia as a biological sciences member.

We will be most pleased to welcome our new members of Council and look forward to their contributions, Professor Cory said.
